The Medieval and Renaissance Studies Certificate

The **Medieval and Renaissance Studies Certificate** requires six courses (18 credits) in the medieval and early modern European period according to the following distributional requirements. All certificate candidates must receive a C or better to receive credit for a course taken to fulfill the certificate requirements.



Recommended Language Study: While foreign language study is not required for the certificate, we encourage participants to enhance their studies of medieval and Renaissance Europe by acquiring a reading knowledge of a modern or historical European language. Studying French, Spanish, or Latin is strongly recommended for those who plan on pursuing an advanced degree or other graduate work in the field.
